Principals' Message

Good attendance is essential for a child's successful experience and academic performance in school. Here are a few ways you can help with attendance issues:

- Arrival: Students can arrive as early as 7:20 a.m. Please do not drop off your child before 7:20 a.m. Students begin their academic task at 7:33 a.m.
- **Tardiness:** It is very important that students arrive at school on time. Frequent tardiness interferes with learning and sends students the message that promptness is not important.
- Absences: Please remember to call the school in the morning if your child is absent from school. It is important, for the safety of the students, to know where all of our students are. If you would like homework assignments, books, etc. to be sent home to a sick child, it is necessary to request this as early in the day as possible to allow teachers time to collect the needed materials. You may also contact teachers directly through email for homework assignments.
- Excuses: While calls about absences are essential, a written excuse is <u>still required</u> when your child returns to school. The excuse should consist simply of the absence date, student's name, reason for the absence, and your signature.
- Educational Trips: If your child will be absent for what could be considered an educational trip (visits considered to have educational value), please ask for an educational trip form from the office. If a completed form is submitted to school, your child would not be considered absent on those days, but will not be eligible for perfect attendance.

Your support of all these attendance areas sends a strong message to your child about the value of learning and time management. With your help, we will continue to provide the best education possible for your child!
