"Mobile Manners"

When that 2:12 P.M. bell rings, each student knows that it not only signifies that they are allowed to go home, but also that they are finally allowed to take out their phone and

look at the many push notifications that have accumulated over the course of the day. Your child finally comes home, and you want to chat with them to see how school went. Their eyes are glued to the last Snapchat they received and their answers to your questions are delayed. This challenge becomes very difficult for parents to address; therefore, here are some helpful tips to teach your child about having "mobile manners".

- When someone is talking with you make sure that they have your undivided attention (eye contact and attention). A text message is typically never urgent, personal contact is.
- Depending on the setting, place your phone on silent instead of vibrate. The vibrating sound can be just as distracting as the sound being on.
- All text messages are traceable, be careful of what you say and send.
- Last but not least there is no substitute for face-toface interactions. Keep talking and keep lines of communication open. Children need our attention as much as we need theirs.

Changes to NYS Health Examination Requirements Effective July 2018

Starting July 2018, mandates in Education Law with regards to physical exams have changed. Health examinations will be required for each student in kindergarten, first, third, fifth, seventh, ninth, and eleventh. All students who are entering the school district for the first time, students receiving certain special education services, and all students involved in interscholastic athletics.

Health examinations may be performed at school by the School Medical Director or performed by the student's primary medical provider. They must be dated no more than twelve months prior to the start of the school year in which they are required or the date of entrance to the school for new entrants.
