

HOMEBOUND INSTRUCTION

Homebound instruction is a service provided to students who are unable to attend school due to medical, emotional or disciplinary problems. The Superintendent of Schools may require physician's approval in individual cases to determine that the student is not able to attend school, that the health of the child would not be jeopardized by the provision of home instruction or to specify any special precautions required. In the case of hospital-bound students, the physician's advice may also be sought.

Secondary students receive instruction for two hours per day and elementary students receive one hour per day. Students receive credit for their work while on homebound instruction.

Home instruction, when furnished, shall be provided only during the weeks when regular school is in session.
