HIGH SCHOOL CREDIT FOR COLLEGE COURSES

The Board of Education endorses programs whereby students may earn college credit for work taken prior to high school graduation. Accordingly, high school credit will be awarded to students who enroll in approved college courses pursuant to the following criteria:

- 1. The number of college courses a student may participate in each school year shall be subject to the approval of the Superintendent of Schools and the high school Principal. The course content, equivalency of instruction, and time requirements shall be approved in advance by the Principal and the Superintendent. In the case of students with disabilities, the above must also be approved by the Committee on Special Education (CSE).
- 2. The costs for any and all such higher education shall be borne by the individual student.
- 3. High school credit shall not be granted for any college course for which a student receives a failing grade.
